Directions to the new Rescheduled SAC Venue- Industry Centre (IS01):

2. Proceed to the left side of the building directly in front – towards the white gate.
3. Walk through the white gate and move directly left to the next gate.
4. Walk through this gate and up the stairs on your right.
5. At the top of the stairs, first classroom on the left.

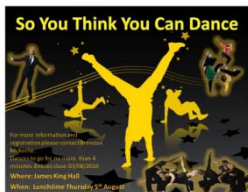

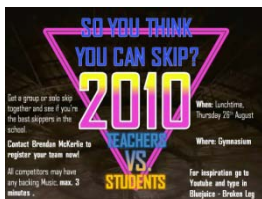
